# ARTISTS OF THE TILE CLUB: Leaving An Artful Legacy

*Over the Fence*

*Beginning at the entrance of The Toledo Club and continuing throughout the rooms and halls are impressive and important works of art. These paintings integrate with the Club's decor and have become part of its legacy. You may find yourself wondering who the artists are behind each painting, and what are the stories that lie behind each artwork?*

*As you may know, some of the prominent paintings are associated with the Tile Club, which is located on 13th Street in downtown Toledo. While the Tilers comprise a diverse group, they all have one thing in common: an interest in art, fellowship, history, and camaraderie enjoyed in an historic setting that simply exudes more than a century of friendliness and civic pride. The Tile Club members are primarily artists, writers, musicians, and other creative types who are enthusiastic about art, and are eager to promote the study of art and to create an atmosphere of good fellowship in which its membership thrives. A large portion of the artwork in The Toledo Club came from artist members of the Tile Club of Toledo. Three of those prominent painters are Edmund H. Osthaus, Thomas S. Parkhurst, and George W. Dinckel.*





up his own studio at Madison Avenue and 11th Street in Toledo, and subsequently joined the Tile Club. In the late 1880s, Osthaus partnered with J.E. Dager to open Maumee Kennels in Toledo.

Osthaus' experience in the world of competitive sporting dogs provided abundant subject matter for his paintings. The Toledo Club now owns four Osthaus oil-on-canvas paintings: *Over the Fence* and *Stag Hounds* in the Centennial Room, *Beltons on Point* in the lobby, and *First Crossing* on the third floor.

## Edmund Osthaus

Destined from an early age to become one of the best-known painters of sporting dogs, Edmund Osthaus was born in Hildesheim, Germany in 1858. During his youth, he developed a passion for art and the outdoors. He had plenty of opportunities to practice his skills by sketching sheep, deer and other game that wandered through the fields and nearby forests. He attended the Gymnasium Josephinum in Hildesheim. He then embarked on a classical art education at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Dusseldorf. His teachers included Johann Christian Kroner, the most renowned painter of wild animals and forest scenery of that era. His family emigrated to America, first to Oshkosh, Wisconsin, and later to Toledo, Ohio. It was in Toledo that Osthaus met *The Blade* publisher and art lover David Ross Locke, who recognized Osthaus' talent and hired him as director of the new Toledo Art Academy. Osthaus left Toledo Art Academy after seven years and opened

In addition to the works on display at the Club, Osthaus' paintings may be seen at the Toledo Museum of Art; the Butler Institute of American Art in Youngstown; the Oshkosh Public Museum; the Port Huron Museum; The Canton (Ohio) Museum of Art; Washington County Museum of Fine Arts in Hagerstown, Maryland; The Art Institute of Chicago; The Ames Plantation Manor House in Grand Junction, Tennessee; the American Kennel Club Museum of the Dog in West St. Louis County, Missouri; and the AKC in New York, among other institutions.

## Thomas Parkhurst

Thomas Parkhurst was born in England and migrated with his parents to upstate New York. At the age of 16, he decided to make Toledo his home when he saw the "Petroleum V. Nasby" letter written by David Locke, who was, at that point, the editor of the *Toledo Weekly Blade*. While he was apprenticed to an interior decorating firm, he developed an interest in art. Later, he and his partner, George Allen, started their own decorating

business. Parkhurst was a self-taught artist, and spent much of his spare time and vacation days on sketching trips, studying nature and its many moods. His successful career and continued interest in art helped establish some of Toledo's most important and influential cultural organizations. He was the founder of The Draconian Club, Toledo's first city club. (In 1889, the Draconian Club's name was changed to The Toledo





Club.) He was the first president of the Toledo Art League, a charter member of the Toledo Dramatic Club, and one of the founders of the Tile Club.

Parkhurst began exhibiting his oils and watercolors during the 1880s at Ohio-Michigan-Indiana tri-state fairs. He continuously engaged in various exhibits in his store on Superior Street, and in an old building owned by Edwin Drummond Libbey on Madison Avenue.

After 35 years of operating their decorating business, Parkhurst and his partner George Allen finally decided to retire. At some point in 1916 or 1917, Parkhurst moved to Carmel, California. He maintained a studio-home overlooking the sea in the Carmel Highlands. "There," he said, "I find inspiration in every tree, rock, and wave."

Parkhurst's painting *Evening Glow* can be found nicely framed on the second floor of the Club.

His art was exhibited at the National Academy of New York City, Carmel Arts & Crafts Club; Gumps, San Francisco; Warden Gallery, San Francisco (1928 memorial); The Toledo Museum of Art, and the Detroit Museum of Art. His paintings can be seen today at the Toledo Museum of Art, the Oakland Museum, Monterey Peninsula Museum, Carmel at Work and Play; Academy in the Woods, and in many private collections.

## George Dinckel

George Dinckel was a noted Toledo artist of the 1920s and 30s. He was well-known for his New England landscapes and seascapes as well as the many portraits he painted. He also was a teacher and lecturer.

Dinckel was born August 19, 1890 to German parents who emigrated to the States and settled in Cincinnati. He was the eldest of three children.

He studied at the Art Academy of Cincinnati from 1911 to 1920. In 1922, Dinckel and his wife Clara Hohneck, who resided in Toledo, decided to travel to Europe to study art in Germany, France, England, Italy, Belgium, and Switzerland. Upon their return to Toledo, George established a studio on an inlet of Lake Erie, about 10 miles from the city, and set to work as an artist. George learned that being an artist didn't always mean a steady paycheck, so he also worked for a time as a sign painter for Thomas Cusack Co., a major sign company in Toledo. Dinckel also made regular painting and sketching trips to New England, where the charm of the landscapes inspired his creativity. Before long, George Dinckel became well-known in Toledo art circles and many of his paintings were hung in Toledo homes.

Although he is now best known for his landscapes and seascapes, when he lived in Toledo he concentrated on portraits. Famous figures painted by Dinckel include Dr. Henry Doermann, former president of The University of Toledo, as well as Dean Lee McKinnon, Dr. William Tucker (one of the founders of the university), Dr. Homer Williams (founder and president emeritus of Bowling Green State University), and others.

Ultimately unable to resist the lure of New England's burgeoning art colony as well as its blue-green water and picturesque rocky shore, George and Clara moved in 1942 to Rockport, Massachusetts. They




continued to visit Toledo for extended periods.

*The Toledo Times* critic Paula Klewer commented on Dinckel's ability and the universal appeal of his work: "His colorful landscapes along the coasts of Maine... have won high praise both here and in the east. His

technique is conservative, but his paintings are vigorous and dramatic. In his seascapes, you feel strongly the weight, motion, and depth of the sea as the irresistible surge of the ocean is broken by the solid masses of rock along the shore."

A striking seascape titled *The Surging Tide* (pictured above) now hangs on the Club's second floor. Framed, it measures 42 by 52 inches, taking up a great expanse of the wall.

Dinckel was an active member of the Artklan, the Toledo Tile Club, and the Scarab Club, a prestigious club in Detroit. He also was a member of the Rockport Art Association, North Shore Arts Association in Gloucester, The Marblehead Arts Association in Rockport, and the Salmagundi Club in Boston.

His paintings can be found not only at The Toledo Club, but also at Scott High School, numerous high schools in Cincinnati and Sandusky, as well as The University of Toledo, Bowling Green State University, and Heidelberg University of Tiffin.

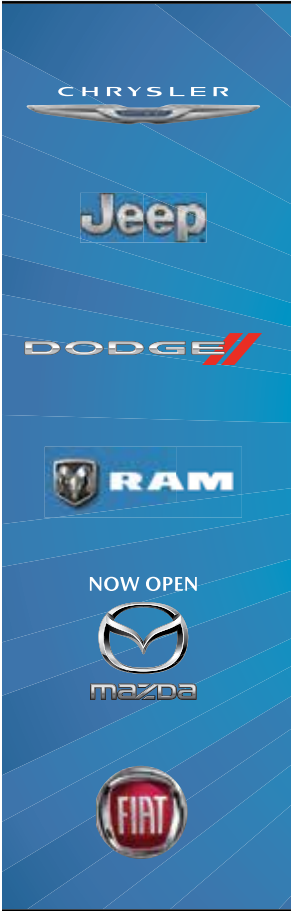
